the inspiration

the inspiration and design ideas for this special series emerged through my recent travels to the lush and secluded rainforest in Borneo. Closely examining vibrant forms of flora and fauna, especially fungi and the tropical forest floor, I was overwhelmed by the many possible textures and organic arrangements this forest held within it. While soaking in Borneo's leafy constructions, micro ecology with unique tree species, mangroves and breathtaking flowers such as the corpse lily, I began to conceive a range of intimately scaled furniture pieces that are like sculptures grounded to reveal a tropical passageway.

The forest collection is exclusively designed for the Architectural Digest Show 2018 drawing from inspiration from travels to the heart of Borneo's rain forest






